

Chris,

Thanks for coming back to me.

Currently the meetings are around getting people round a table that are directly or indirectly involved in the Renewables industry in Northern Ireland. What we aim to do is to get a definitive picture of where the industry is and where it wants to go. We want and need the stakeholders presently and in the future to engage with us and likewise ourselves with them.

We envisage the group breaking down into smaller managed teams in the Macro and Micro scales covering from Biomass & Land Use, Renewable Electricity, Heat Pumps and Transport. Where we would see UFU having a stake and influence would be on the alternate land uses and production of biomass providing new economic opportunities for farmers perhaps becoming fuel suppliers. Also an area of interest may be the production of electricity on land via wind

turbines etc as a revenue stream for farmers. Indeed there was some discussion around the production of electric and the associated costs that are currently holding back the economies of scale that are required.

This currently is led by the SDLP but I would see it moving beyond this and engagement with other parties to ensure a sound base for the industry going forward.
