# Wood Pellet Calculations



## All Standard Plus as Tonnes Wood Pellet

- 2015 LPG allowance 127.4L  $\equiv$  0.22T
- 2015 LPG Costing agreed at £180 tonne  $\equiv$  0.26 T  
(Calculated back from heat capacity and assumes they were happy with this at that time!)
- GB Usage (average based March data)  $\equiv$  0.37 T  
(will refresh with up to date data- Simon can you send)
- NI Irrelevant information redacted by the RHI Inquiry evidence based)  $\equiv$  0.42T
- NI Tom Forgrave proposition  $\equiv$  0.70T

All NI Farms have 1 by 99kWh boiler per house except Tom who is now fitting 2 by 99 kWh per farm (old scheme) I think this is excessive and indicates an interest in Rhi farming over Poultry farming



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
