Just to define the order of significance of this issue

McNaughtons planned to use one 99kWh Boiler to heat 2 houses – a VERY efficient use of a boiler and ensures all energy produced is “responsible” but the nature of the design.

CAFRE suggest that a rule of thumb usage per poultry house is c400,000 kWh per annum – with the set up above the maximum the boiler will be able to supply is 500,000 which is 250,000 per house per annum

The only outcome we can look at is getting the application through pre November!

Looking at the consequential loss of the scheme over the 20 years it looks like this:
