Important Issue

This document from CAFRE may help set "advice"

In summary I read this as CAFRE suggest that **0.43** Tonnes Peller per thou STD+ (or 0.53 Tonnes Pellet per thou HWF 30kg – I have corrected all back to 38kg for discussion/comparison) is what they would expect

This is above our costings but that is reasonable we are average.

For a typical new 1650sqm house it would be about 430,000 kWh per house per year from CAFRE – I have quoted 400,000kWh as a guide number that will be easily defended and I have done that at the Cookstown Broiler meeting at the committee repeatedly – still happy with this number – certain growers think it should be double!

The data I have for NI – this is estimates and some big assumptions done for bird type etc but it should still stand up for now.

NI average **0.48** tonnes Std+ equivalent NI average without one main outlier **0.39** Highest we have above **1.0** Tonner per thou!

GB numbers as best I can estimate - something similar big variations average about **0.54** but some above 0.7 tonnes some as low as 0.3 tonnes
