How do you read this?

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- The suggestion that Moy Park saw how lucrative this scheme could be and 'orchestrated' the participation of a lot of poultry farmers

Moy Park saw and understood the scheme – growers were keen to participate and we were involved facilitating this investment with AHP payments for hot water heating!

- Moy Park recognised the benefits (financial) of the scheme – in a way the dept didn't

The department introduced the scheme and at all times understood as much as the rest of us. They commissioned CAFRE to do some work in July 15 so they kept themselves informed you could argue.

- The poultry sector is going to benefit from huge amounts of public money because of how this scheme was set up. They used the figures from the audit office report to illustrate this – quoting a net profit of £737,580 for one boiler over 20 years – they extrapolated that up to £3million for a farmer with 4 boilers.

I would use a more conservative number on usage (the scheme has safeguards for inappropriate use) but even with that for a grower with 4 houses and 4 boilers the number would be c £2m -

- They stated a number of times that Moy Park wasn't doing anything wrong but said that people would find it shocking to discover how the poultry sector is set to benefit from this scheme.

- I recon we have 678 99kWh uncapped and 90 199 kWh capped rough income over 20 years c£500M
