"IrBEA Executive Noel Gavigan provided detailed insight into how the Wood Fuel Quality Assurance scheme (WFQA) works, including standards, audits, compliance requirements and costs as well as providing a vivid demonstration of how to determine chip size when sampling. WFQA member Kenny McCauley (McCauley Wood Fuels) gave a suppliers view including numerous illustrations and tips on how to maximise benefits from the scheme. There is strong interest in NI in the WFQA as an industry standard and this was clear from a presentation by DETI official Seamus Hughes. DETI's intention is to examine the practicalities of introducing a similar scheme possibly including recognition of quality schemes such as the WFQA alongside the Biomass Suppliers List (BSL) - a sustainability standard used for assessing fuel eligibility for Renewable Heat Incentive (RHI) payments in Great Britain.
