Good Evening Seamus,

I am processing with several Preliminary applications. I am currently faced with an issue, for the preliminary application you need to provide planning permission for the installation, in the event of not needing planning permission you must provide a formal letter from the local planning authority stating this is the case.

Planning permission as I am sure you are aware is a lengthy process and giving the latest suspension there is no time to achieve passed planning permission. Further to this in order to get a formal letter from local planning authorities, they claim it will be at least 28 days before they can process such documentation. Again we do not have this time.

Within a regular accreditation application there is no mention or no need to provide planning permission or alternative, if the suspension had not come into play this would not be an issue. Can you please advise on this or provide me with an alternative. Potentially a covering letter from your department I could upload onto suffice documentation has been received.

If you could get back to me as soon as possible I would appreciate it.
