Thanks Terry, this is a helpful comparison.

The fuel costs used would indicate that the examples are from early on in the GB Scheme when oil was still more costly than biomass. However, the annual RHI payments are comparable to what the NI's payments should have been under a capped tariff. However, without a cap/tier the average annual NI payments are over £25k per installation/boiler are much higher than any of the worked examples.
