Barnett consequentials were paid on all areas of the DECC settlement so the answer to your first question is "yes". However, bear in mind that much of DECC's spending is UK wide which is reflected in your low comparability factor.

Our understanding is that the renewable energy fund is indeed UK-wide and being run by DECC so no reason why this will not extend to NI. DECC have yet to announce mre details of the scheme.

I am just following up on a few issues related to the 2010 Spending Review. The NIE Settlement letter confirmed that £2/4/7/12 million of AME funding will be available over the SR period for a NI Renewable Heat Incentive Scheme. I can confirm that we intend to introduce such a scheme (through DETI) and that we will feed into AME forecasts in due course.

There are two related issues announced as part of the 2010 Spending Review:

1. £60 million to support offshore wind manufacturing infrastructure at ports in England.
2. £140 million to assist renewable energy projects across the UK.

I would be grateful for confirmation that NIE did indeed receive Barnett consequentials of the £60 million fund for offshore wind.

I would also be grateful for details on how the £140 million renewable energy fund will operate. Is it UK wide? Will NI companies be able to access the fund? Who will administer it and how can firms apply?
