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As discussed, the Supply engagement with DETI on this case has focused on ensuring DETI has the necessary approvals in place to reduce the tariffs as quickly as practically possible – indeed this was a condition of our recent approval.

DETI had requested approval for the scheme to run at the lower tariff rate until December 2016 – however as the future of the GB wide scheme (and therefore NI funding) will be clarified as part of this month's SR, the DFP approval was only granted until 31 March 2016.

The clear message throughout our engagement with DETI has been that existing tariffs are now too high and need to be reduced as soon as possible – and this is why we prioritised our approval to allow legislation to be brought forward in early November. Any delay in that legislation is a matter for DETI and is outside the influence and control of Supply.
