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1. Parties to the Data Sharing Protocol	
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2. Introduction and Background	
<p>Certain functions are conferred on DETI under the Renewable Heat Incentive Scheme Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2012 (Non – Domestic NI Regulations) as amended by the Domestic Heat Incentive Scheme Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2014 (Domestic RHI Regulations). Non-Domestic Northern Ireland Renewable Heat Incentive (NI RHI) is a scheme run by DETI that provides financial support to non-domestic renewable heat generators and producers of biomethane who are based in Northern Ireland. Under Arrangements with DETI, made pursuant to section 114 of the Energy Act 2011, Ofgem exercise some of the NI RHI administrative functions on behalf of DETI and as a result Ofgem holds some information which DETI requires to perform its functions under the Non-Domestic NI Regulations.</p> <p>The primary objective for the NI RHI is to increase the uptake of renewable heat to ten percent by 2020. The ten percent target for renewable heat equates to 1.6TWh (or an additional 1.3 TWh when considering existing levels). This target was included in the Strategic Energy Framework and an interim target of four percent renewable heat by 2015 has been included in the Programme for Government.</p> <p>DETI administers the Domestic Northern Ireland Renewable Heat Incentive (Domestic RHI) but there are certain provisions in the Domestic RHI Regulations which are relevant to some of the conferred functions on Ofgem under the Arrangements, and as such DETI also hold certain relevant information.</p>	

3. Purpose	
<p>In the course of its operation of the NI RHI scheme, Ofgem collects and holds data supplied by applicants and participants and data generated in relation to administering the scheme for each application and installation. Some of the data held by Ofgem will include personal data within the meaning of the Data Protection Act 1998. Ofgem is the office of GEMA and ‘Ofgem’ and GEMA are used interchangeably in this document.</p> <p>DETI as the administrator of the Domestic RHI scheme collects and holds data supplied by domestic applicants and participants and data generated in relation to administering the Domestic scheme for each application and installation.</p>	

The data sharing is to enable DETI to carry out its function to obtain a complete picture of Scheme measures which are: To fully monitor the rollout and progress of the Scheme, particularly the distributional impacts; To monitor its effectiveness in combining with other energy efficiency and demand reduction policies; To publish RHI official statistics; To further develop associated policies to meet carbon reduction targets; and to inform any evaluations. It also enables DETI to share information with GEMA necessary to enable GEMA to carry out the Conferred Functions and the Ancillary Activities under the Arrangements.

4. Legal Basis for Data Sharing

DETI has established a Non-Domestic RHI Scheme under section 113 of the Energy Act 2013 and the Renewable Heat Incentive Scheme Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2012 (Non – Domestic NI Regulations , as amended by the Domestic Heat Incentive Scheme Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2014 (Domestic RHI Regulations) (collectively referred to as “NI RHI Regulations” in this Data Sharing Protocol.

Section 114 of the Energy Act 2011 provides that DETI and the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority (GEMA) may enter into arrangements for GEMA to act on behalf of DETI for or in connection with the carrying out of any functions that may be conferred on DETI in respect of Northern Ireland (NI) RHI. DETI and GEMA signed an Administrative Arrangements document on 28th December 2012 for the administration of NI RHI. The Administrative Arrangements were amended in 2014 to provide for sharing of certain functions between DETI and GEMA. The Administrative Arrangements were renewed on 12th December 2014 to reflect recent legislative changes to the NI RHI Regulations. The Administrative Arrangements, as amended and renewed, are collectively referred to as “Arrangements” in this document.

Paragraph 3.2 of the Arrangements provides that GEMA will (a) provide DETI with (i) such information as is necessary to enable DETI to carry out in a proper manner the powers and duties imposed on DETI by regulations 47(1)(a) and 50; and (ii) such other information as DETI may reasonable request which GEMA may hold in relation to the Conferred Functions

Paragraph 4.1 of the Arrangement provides that DETI will share information with GEMA necessary to enable GEMA to carry out the Conferred Functions and the Ancilliary Activities in a proper manner. In doing so, DETI will comply with all relevant legislation and have respect for any personal or commercial confidentiality. Where DETI is made aware of such information it will notify GEMA that it holds the information and provide it to GEMA on request.

Ofgem’s ability to disclose information that it obtains is subject to section 105 or 105A Utilities Act 2000.

Section 105 provides that information which has been obtained under or by virtue of (section 100of the Energy Act 2008...) and which relates to the affairs of any individual or to any particular business shall not be disclosed during the lifetime of the individual or so long as the business continues to be carried on, except as provided in the remainder of that section.

Section 105A (1) applies to any information provided to the Authority

(a) for the purpose of enabling it to carry out its functions as designated regulatory authority for Great Britain; and

(b) by the designated regulatory authority for Northern Ireland or for another Member State (“the originating authority”) in accordance with Article 38(1) of the Electricity Directive or Article 42(1) of the Gas Directive.

Section 105(2) provides “subsection (1) does not apply to a disclosure made with the consent of the individual or the person for the time being carrying on the business”.

Section 105(A)(2) provides that Ofgem may disclose information to which section 105A applies only if—

- (a) the originating authority has confirmed in writing that the originating authority would be permitted to disclose the information in the circumstances in question; and
- (b) the Authority would be permitted under section 105 to disclose the information if it was received under or by virtue of an enactment listed in subsection (1) of that section.

Section 105(A) (1) applies whether the information is provided directly or indirectly by the originating authority.

NI RHI privacy statement which the applicants/participants consent to on accreditation states that Ofgem may use the information provided, or disclose it for various purposes, including to carry out Ofgem’s administrative functions in relation to the NI RHI scheme and to meet its legal obligations in relation to periodic provision of information to DETI. Additionally, it states that Ofgem may also be required to disclose to DETI information, including information on installations or participants and other personal information held, upon request by DETI, or to comply with legal obligations relating to the periodic provision of information to DETI. Where such information is provided to DETI in respect of large undertakings, details such as names, aid amount and intensity may also be passed onto the European Commission and published on their website.

Ofgem and DETI therefore have consider whether section 105 or 105A Utilities Act 2000 which prohibits disclosure of information received by Ofgem in exercise of its functions except in certain circumstances listed in those provisions applies. Section 105 or 105A Utilities Act does not apply to NI RHI as the information referred to in S.105 only cover the Great Britain regulations made under section 100 Energy Act 2008. Even if section 105 is engaged, consents by applicants / participants to the NI RHI privacy statement as stated above exempt application of section 105 .

Ofgem and DETI recognise that:

- (a) much of the data covered by these requests will be “personal data” for the purposes of the Data Protection Act 1998;
- (b) processing (and disclosure) of any personal data from applicants or participants under the Non-Domestic RHI scheme must be fully in accordance with, and subject to, the Data Protection Act 1998, and to relevant Data Protection Principles set out in that Act; and

It is noted that section 35(1) of the Data Protection Act 1998 provides that:

“(1) Personal data are exempt from the non-disclosure provisions where the disclosure is

required by or under any enactment ...”

DETI confirms that for the purposes of these formal requests, the “enactment” relied on for the purposes of section 35 of the Data Protection Act 1998 is section 114 of the Energy Act 2011 (EA 2011) which provides that DETI and the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority (GEMA) may enter into arrangements for GEMA to act on behalf of DETI for or in connection with the carrying out of any functions that may be conferred on DETI in respect of Northern Ireland (NI) RHI and the Arrangements made pursuant to the EA 2011 - as applicable and to be individually stated on each request.

It is further noted that section 27 of the Data Protection Act 1998 defines the non-disclosure provisions, and qualifies the scope and application of the exemption from their application.

DETI acknowledges that disclosure of data in response to these formal requests can only take place in compliance with and subject to the provisions of section 27 of the Data Protection Act 1998. DETI will not be requesting any sensitive personal data as defined in that Act.

It is noted that section 27 of the Data Protection Act 1998 qualifies the exemption in section 35 of that Act such that part of the first data protection principle (that data must be processed fairly), must still be met. Principles 6-8 of the DPA must also be met.

With respect to the Schedule 2 of the Data Protection Act 1998 condition for fair processing, Ofgem is required to meet its reporting obligations under the Arrangements , and it is also relevant that participants in the NI RHI scheme have been provided with a privacy notice as part of their application process, which specifically puts them on notice that information provided may be shared with DETI. For the purposes of the application of this test to DETI, DETI’s Schedule 2 condition for processing is condition 5(c) and 5(d), the requirement for performance of government/public functions and legitimate interest in ensuring applicants to the scheme get the best possible service and realise the maximum carbon savings.

The sixth data protection principle will be met. The contact information will be used for research on the scheme, but this will be voluntary for those contacted.

The seventh data protection principle will be met since the data will be held at the appropriate level of security for this data. This is covered in more detail in the Security and Assurance section below.

The eighth data protection principle will be met since the data will be stored on servers in the UK.

5. Organisations Involved

This data sharing will involve DETI and Ofgem only. DETI will become the data controller under the Data Protection Act 1998 upon receipt of the data from Ofgem.

6. Data to be Shared

Paragraph 3 of the Arrangements provides that GEMA will (a) provide DETI with:

- (i) such information as is necessary to enable DETI to carry out in a proper manner the powers and duties imposed on DETI by regulations 47(1)(a) and 50 NI RHI

- Regulations; and,
- (ii) such other information as DETI may reasonably request which GEMA may hold in relation to the conferred functions.

Ofgem will provide a monthly progress report which includes a snapshot of the 'non domestic RHI register' at month end for all records and any information that would enable DETI to carry out its duty of publication under regulation 51 NI RHI Regulations. The extract Ofgem supply from the RHI register should cover applicants whose applications were made up to the last working day of the calendar month.

The data that Ofgem will share with DETI and the frequency of the sharing are set out in Annex A. The data will cover information relating to the applicant or participant, the technology they have installed, the metering they have in place, the heat generated, payments made and some information recorded by Ofgem in relation to the accreditation processes. This will include, details of the names of NI RHI applicants and participants, their addresses (residential or commercial), telephone numbers and email addresses.

DETI will not require any sensitive personal data as defined by the Data Protection Act 1998 or information on applicants' bank account details.

DETI will share information with GEMA necessary to enable GEMA to carry out the Conferred Functions and the Ancillary Activities in a proper manner.

The data that DETI will share with Ofgem and the frequency of the sharing are set out in Annex B. The data will cover information relating to the applicant or participant and some information recorded by DETI in relation to the accreditation processes. This will include details of the addresses of Domestic RHI applicants and participants.

7. Requests for Information

In the event that either DETI or Ofgem receive a request for access to such information contained in the RHI register, then each party will respond to that request as required by law.

Where it involves data that has been shared under this Data Sharing Protocol, the parties will notify each other promptly of receipt of the request and co-operate as necessary to ensure it is addressed in accordance with relevant legislation.

This covers information requested under the Data Protection Act 1998, Freedom of Information Act 2000 and the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 as well as parliamentary questions.

8. Responsibilities of each party

- Ofgem will be the data controller for the personal data it holds as will DETI once it receives the personal data from Ofgem.
- Once the data has been transferred to DETI it becomes the responsibility of the relevant DETI Information Asset Owner.

- Both parties are responsible for ensuring they have organisational and technical measures in place to protect the information.
- Both parties will comply with the eight data protection principles in all their processing of the data.
- Ofgem has audit and quality assurance checks in place which will enable personal information to be recorded accurately. DETI may also conduct checks of data accuracy across the NI RHI Scheme. If either party identifies an error, Ofgem will investigate and amend the data appropriately, if required.
- The DETI Information Asset Owner will ensure that the data is recorded as an asset on his or her divisional Information Asset Register.
- Ofgem will continue to ensure that an appropriate Privacy Statement, advising on arrangements for fair processing and information sharing between Ofgem and DETI, is visible as part of the RHI application process).

9. Security

- Both parties will take appropriate technical and organisational measures against unauthorised or unlawful processing of personal data and against accidental loss to, destruction of, or damage to, personal data.
- DETI will receive all personal data from Ofgem via secure GSI email.
- Upon receipt of the Scheme data, the respective DETI Information Asset Owner is ultimately responsible for its security.
- The data will be stored in DETI's electronic document and records management system with suitable restrictions applied to the relevant containers.
- Access to the RHI register will be restricted to designated members of staff who have a genuine business need to see the data.
- The number of designated members of staff able to access the RHI Register will be kept to a reasonable minimum.
- DETI will only publish aggregate results that meet the requirements of Principle 5 of the Code of Practice for Official Statistics² on confidentiality and in line with the Data Protection Act 1998.

10. Retention and Disposal

Ofgem and DETI will only keep the data for as long as required.. The DETI Informaiton Asset Owner will ensure that specific reference to the data is made in the DETI retention and disposal schedule.

When the retention period has expired, DETI will ensure that the data is destroyed in line with departmental procedures or retained for historical preservation if requested by the Public Record Office of Northern Ireland.

11. Data Breach / Data Loss

In the event any data shared is breached or lost, the relevant Data Controller will instigate an investigation in line with its organizational policy and procedures. Within DETI, responsibility for this will rest with the relevant Information Asset Owner.

12. Review / Termination of Data Sharing Protocol

This Data Sharing Protocol will come into effect on the date of signature by both parties and

will expire when the delivery and evaluation of the NI RHI scheme ends or when the Arrangement is terminated.

It will be reviewed by DETI and Ofgem;

- after amendment to the Arrangements
- after any regulation changes
- as required
- where there are new and additional requests for data
- to ensure it is up to date and does not need further amendment to reflect changes to the scheme.

The effectiveness of this agreement will be assessed after 6 months, or in the event of a breach of the terms of this agreement, or any statutory obligation which relates to the transferred data by either party, whichever occurs soonest, and then every 6 months thereafter until the agreement is terminated.

Either party may terminate this agreement by giving at least three months' notice in writing to the other party at any time.

Any proposed changes to the timing or content of the data to be shared will be agreed in writing between the signatories below (or their successors) and the appropriate Annex will then be updated.

This agreement is not intended to be legally binding, and no legal obligations or legal rights shall arise between the parties from this agreement. However both parties will endeavour to comply with the provisions of this agreement .
