Dear all,

I had a phone call today from Davina at DETI. They are finalising their policy for the Domestic scheme and want to consider the following proposal:

-Making anything that is >100 kW and Domestic fall into the non-domestic scheme. This would obviously require a change in legislation - specifically to how non-domestic/domestic is defined. She says she wouldn't expect any of the eligibility criteria to change for these installations.

I said that we'd need to consider the impacts of this. I have also said that we would need an idea of expected application volumes for this type of applicant.

Can we discuss:

- What are the implications of this for us? Most obvious one seems to be increased NI volumes = more resource.
- Are there any eligibility criteria that apply to the non-domestic scheme that is difficult for domestic participants to comply with?
- This is quite different from the GB rules (may be potentially simpler and help the GB agenda on simplification). Do we/DECC/DETI care about consistency between both schemes?
